

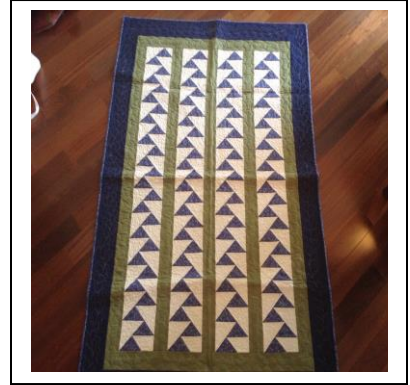
Workshops

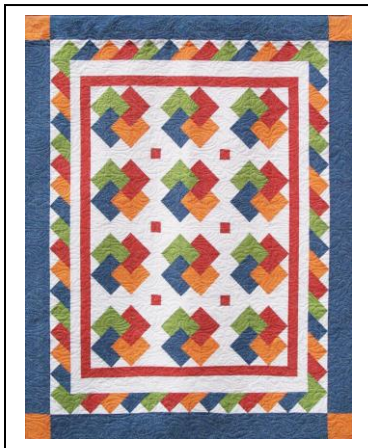
STAND ALONE PATTERN—NO SPECIAL TOOLS REQUIRED

Migrating Geese look hard, but are made simple by using Deb Tucker's method of piecing. This method does require your best cutting and piecing skills, however once you learn the technique you will have a world of new possibilities. This is a downloadable pattern from www.studio180design.net.

ONE-TOOL PATTERNS

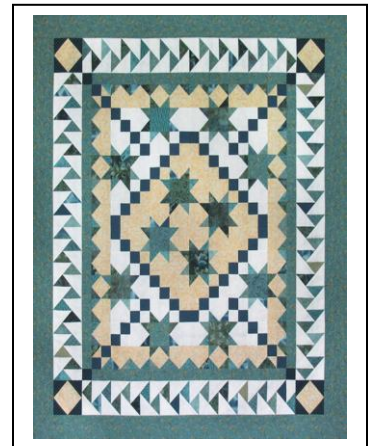


Solitaire is a Studio 180 Design pattern that is perfect for beginning quilters. It requires the use of one tool, the Tucker Trimmer I. Students will gain extensive practice in making perfect half-square triangles, combination units and hour glass units.

These techniques will carry over to any future pattern that calls for half-square triangles, combination units, or hour glass units.

Southern Hospitality is a Studio 180 Design pattern that can be completed with one tool, the Square². Students will learn to create the Square² unit, little houses, and the migrating geese which is in the border.

This pattern is a great way to use up a few scraps.



Galaxy may appear to have curved edges, but that is not the case! Keep those perfect points on every star using the Studio 180 Design V-block tool. You will be amazed as to how easy the blocks will go together and the unique pattern they create.

The Hunter's Star . . . a very traditional quilt block that *used* to require diamond shapes. All of that is eliminated when you use the Studio 180 Design tool, Rapid Fire Hunter's Star. The layout possibilities are endless! This will become one of your "go to" tools when you need a quick table runner or throw quilt for a



During a 1-day workshop, students will be able to create a table runner or table topper. Students can apply their new Rapid Fire Hunter's Star skills by making the SueNami pattern, (at the right) which also requires the use of the Wing Clipper I to create the chevron border.



Love the Lemoyne Star block, but hate cutting those diamonds and then having to deal with Y seams? The Studio 180 Design Rapid Fire Lemoyne Star tool totally eliminates diamond shapes and Y seams. Yes, it is possible. Do not cut off another point to your Lemoyne Star again. Blocks can be made as small as 3” all the way up to 12” square.



Make it a full weekend retreat and we will learn three more variations of the Lemoyne Star. Within a day, people are addicted to this tool. What variations of the Lemoyne Star will fill in your Constellations pattern?

Hint: The black, white, and red Constellations pattern is the same layout as this new sampler, but the new sampler is using a variety of the Lemoyne star variations.



T-SHIRT QUILTS



Just can't quite get up the nerve to actually cut those t-shirts. Let Phyllis reduce your stress and walk you through the process of properly stabilizing the t-shirts and making a quilt.
